Please remember that tomorrow, Friday June 3rd, is a non-instructional day and school will not be in session. Enjoy a lovely weekend.

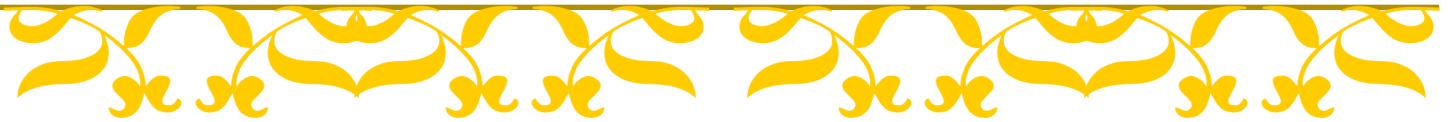

Dear Parents of Choice School Students,

It is that time of year and we are already starting to look ahead to next year.

We want to share with you some of the visions and goals PAC has set, as well as give you some practical information and suggest ways you can get involved. Our current PAC Executive runs with parents who have children in grade 6 and will be graduating soon. This is a great opportunity for parents whose kids are in younger grades to get involved and to learn over the next year.

We urge all parents or guardians to take a look and consider putting your name forward for one of the positions. If we cannot fill those positions that could mean that your children will not have any additional events that the PAC traditionally organizes or the many other services and supplementary supports the PAC can only provide with new volunteers.

What is the PAC?

The Parents Advisory Committee is dedicated to the education and well-being of the children and to helping the school provide the best education possible for its students as it works towards common goals. The role of the PAC includes:
supporting educational opportunities for students

- facilitating communication between home and school
- advising the administrative team of ongoing issues and concerns
- advising the administrative team/staff of parental views about school programs, policies and activities
- organizing parent activities and events (educational, special events, fundraising, etc.)

Who belongs on PAC?

ALL parents/guardians of students at Choice school automatically belong to and are voting members of the Choice School PAC. Parents are encouraged to participate in meaningful educational activities and decision-making to strengthen the role of families in education.

Executive Positions are available for the 2016-7 school year. The roles include:

Chairperson - convene and preside at membership, special and executive meetings; prepare and present meeting agenda; act as official spokesperson for the organization; and act as a signing officer for the PAC.

Co-Chair or Vice Chair- assume the responsibilities of the Chairperson in the Chairperson's absence or upon request; assist the Chairperson in the performance of his/her duties; act as a signing officer; and accept extra duties as required.

Secretary- record the minutes of all general, special, and executive meetings; keep an accurate and up-to-date copy of the Constitution and Bylaws and have copies available for members upon request; and issue and receive correspondence/minutes on behalf of the organization.

Treasurer- one of the signing officers of the PAC; receive all funds for the PAC; disburse funds authorized by the executive or members; maintain an accurate record of all expenditures of the Council; give a report of all receipts and expenditures at the general meetings; deposit all funds collected on behalf of the PAC in an account at a recognized financial institution; assist with any financial audits and ensure that the accounting procedures as laid out by Board of Directors are followed.

When Does PAC meet?

Parent meetings are held once a month and the principal Ms Chartres also attends. This is a time for all parents to hear the latest on happenings at Choice School, and to discuss parents' ideas and ask questions. The Choice School PAC meets on the **first Friday of every month at 8:30 a.m.**
