### Principal's Message

The month of November is flying by, and shortly we'll be into the holiday season. Details will be sent along shortly about the exciting events we have planned to celebrate the season at Choice.

Teachers are currently writing reports of each student's progress during Term One, to be sent home on December 16<sup>th</sup>. Staff has drafted a new report card to reflect the intent of the new curriculum; it will be piloted this term and parent feedback invited. We are holding two information sessions for parents next week to explain the format of the new report: Tuesday, November 29<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday, November 30<sup>th</sup> between 3:15 and 3:45 in the Choice library. This production will expand our understanding of sustainability and the need to be environmentally responsible.

Yesterday evening was the first in our Gifted Lecture series for the year, presented by our Occupational Therapist, Mrs. Joanna Thackwray, on the important topic *Executive Functioning and the Gifted*. Mrs. Thackwray supports many of our students in helping them to become effective and self-aware learners, and we are very appreciative that she was able to share her expertise with parents and guests. This **Friday, November 25, Choice will host an Open House and concurrently, an Usbourne Book Fair** presented by Mrs. Robin Classen. We thank Mrs. Classen for organizing the fair, and for offering to contribute her commission toward expanding the school library. The Book Fair will be open throughout the morning. # **Choice School's Food Drive for the Greater Vancouver Food Bank**

Beginning on Oct. 31, 2016, Choice School will be taking part in a Food Drive. The Greater Vancouver Food Bank's stores are at their lowest levels in over 30 years, and Choice School wants to do our part to help our community by collecting donations of high quality, nutritious foods for families and individuals in need.

Class E will be presenting on Food Security in BC and basic nutrition to the younger grades, making posters to advertise, and decorating boxes for food donations. At the end of the Food Drive, Class E will take a field trip to the Food Bank and spend the morning volunteering in the warehouse, organizing food stores and learning about how the Food Bank operates.

The Top 10 Most Needed Items, according to the Food Bank, are:

- 1) Canned Fish (Salmon or Tuna)
- 2) Canned Meat (Turkey or Chicken)
- 3) Canned Beans (Black Beans, Chickpeas, Kidney Beans)
- 4) Hearty Meals (Canned Soups, Stews, and Chilis)
- 5) Nut Butters (100% Natural Almond, Peanut, or Cashew Butter)
- 6) Pasta (uncooked and packaged)
- 7) Rice (uncooked and packaged)
- 8) Whole Grain Breakfast Cereals
- 9) Canned Vegetables
- 10) Canned Fruit (Packed in its own Juice or Water)

Donation boxes are currently set up in my office. If you are able, we ask that you please bring a food donation with any of the items on this list if you are attending Choice School's PAC Meetings, etc. or any other day you happen to be at Choice! Boxes will be set up until the end of November/beginning of December.
