Say it with passion through understanding of meaning and make it yours by taking it to the stage.</p> <p>(Grades 5 to 8)</p>	<p>Dino-Explorers</p> <p>If you love dinosaurs, this is the program for you. We will learn about the time periods in which the dinosaurs flourished and explore the different kinds of dinosaurs that lived during this time. Paleontological sources will help us understand details such as what they ate, where they lived, what they looked like, and what caused their extinction. We will bring the Mesozoic Era to life at Choice School by going on a mini dinosaur excavation, inventing our own dinosaurs, and building a model of our favorite dino.</p> <p>(Grades 1 to 4)</p>	<p>Math Pirates</p> <p>On a map, x marks the spot where a pirate can find treasure. As a math pirate this summer, you'll go in search of the mysteries hidden by variables like x. Are you a math enthusiast who wants to build your knowledge and stretch your understanding? This introductory course will look at the basics of algebra then extend to modelling, graphing and solving linear relationships. After mastering some new concepts, we'll use them to tackle real-world problems and investigations.</p> <p>(Grades 5 to 8)</p>	<p>STEAM</p> <p>Do you like to design, build and solve problems creatively? Then STEAM is for you. Using the principles of STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Mathematics) students will be engaged in project based experiments. Problems will include building a sound proof box, protecting an egg from a fall and moving a marble across the room. STEAM Learning is hands-on and engaging, and strengthens a student's proficiency with real-world problem solving now and in their future.</p> <p>(Grades 1 to 4)</p>
<p>Create Your Country:</p> <p>Using <i>Weslandia</i> as your backdrop, you will create your own country. Make your country a place of curiosity where everyone wants to be a visitor or a citizen. Create a name, a flag, an anthem, all the parts to making a country as unique as you. Be ready to build, to write, and to use your imagination to develop your particularly unique part of the world.</p> <p>(Grades 1 to 4)</p>	<p>Around the World in a Whirlwind</p> <p>Explore the world in five days in this exciting program for curious and adventurous minds. Using our passports and airline tickets, we will journey to countries on each continent and explore different cultures, lifestyles, foods, historical sites, and the main attractions of each place. We will gain an understanding of what life is like in other parts of the world by using research, photos, magazines, travel books, and travel websites, and put together country profiles using these valuable sources.</p> <p>(Grades 4 to 8)</p>	<p>How Many Ways Can You Solve a Problem?</p> <p>Higher order thinking skills help us to tackle complex problems by breaking them down into smaller chunks and then applying a variety of strategies to come to a solution. This summer camp session will expose students to several problem-solving strategies and have them applying those strategies in real-world situations. These skills could assist students with math problems, STEM projects and executive functioning development in the future.</p> <p>(Grades 1 to 4)</p>	<p>Camping 101</p> <p>Do you camp, or have you ever wondered what it would be like to go camping? Do you have all the skills you need? Join Camping 101 to learn how to camp successfully: planning, packing, orienteering, building a fire, putting up a tent, cooking on a camp stove, and survival skills.
